A little over 10 years ago, I was collaborating with colleagues in West Palm Beach in a program for CAP – Certified Advisors in Philanthropy. Through this initiative, we were trying to identify where we could make additional philanthropic impact in our community. At the time, my wife, Joan, and I were big fans of the program "Shark Tank" and thought, "what if we created an organization that provided investment and mentoring for students who wanted to create impactful programs that addressed issues facing our local community? In June 2015, after encouragement from many supporters, Philanthropy Tank was born.

Ten years later, we are thrilled to gather to celebrate all of our CHANGEmakers. We are grateful to our coaches and mentors for their time and expertise to guide our students in their efforts – thankful to our community partners who have collaborated and utilized our student programs to meet unmet community needs and indebted to our donors and Philanthropist Investors who invested in Philanthropy Tank's efforts to identify, cultivate, and empower our future leaders.

Since our inception, over 65% of all our programs remain active. This is a testament to the sustainability of our mission and the impact that our students have made ten years after we embarked on our efforts. 40% of these programs have become their own nonprofit organizations. As we set forth on our next decade, we are excited to engage new groups of students as existing CHANGEmakers are enabling their successors to take the reins and continue to grow their programs. In addition, we now have a robust group of Philanthropy Tank alumni! We have also developed some exciting partnerships, including our partnership with the School District of Palm Beach County to create school Philanthropy Tank Clubs and the opportunity to identify new youth-led programs through the City of West Palm Beach, Youth Action Climate Fund.

While we are proud of our accomplishments thus far, we continue to strive to reach more students and make a greater impact in the communities we serve. Together, we are Empowering CHANGEmakers and growing the future of philanthropy.
